
The Lovely Bones by Alice Sebold

summer program for gifted students uncover shocking secrets in the sanatorium-turned-dorm where they're staying--secrets that link them all to the asylum's dark past"


Conversion by Katherine Howe -When girls start


centuries ago.

Dracula by Bram Stoker -After escaping the fortress




of Count Dracula,

A Living Nightmare by Darren Shan -Two boys who




are best friends visit an illegal freak show, where an encounter with a vampire and a deadly spider forces them to make life-changing choices.

The Graveyard Book by Neil Gaiman - The orphan





The Screaming Staircase by Jonathan Stroud




-Follows three young operatives of a Psychic Detection Agency as they battle an epidemic of ghosts in London.




The Ravenous by Amy Lukavics -From the outside,


youngest and most beloved sister dies in a tragic accident, the sisters discover just how far they will go to keep their family together.
